From the same localities from which Anticoma tenuis is dating also another species is present, characterized by the strongly elongated and very slender body, being absolutely evenly thick from the posterior end of the oesophageal region until the anus and tapering only scarcely noticeably in the oesophageal region.

Diagnose: Cuticle thin and smooth; head rounded, provided with very short, submedian bristles. (Cervical hairs were not found.) Oesophagus of mediate length, posteriorly gradually and only very little increasing. Tail tapering in the first third conically and in the 2 posterior thirds uniformly more strongly thinned. Spicules short, slender, only slightly curved, rounded at the proximal end. Supplementary auxilliary organ situated immediately in front of the spicules. Vulva situated caudad to the middle of the body. Female organs paired-symmetrical, with reflexed ovaries.
