

Camacolaimus paratardus n. sp.

Locality and material. — South Georgia. St. 28: 1♀

Dimensions: $L = 1,360$ mm., $a = 35,79$, $\beta = 6,57$, $\gamma = 25,72$

This small species, present in a single female from St. 28, the body of which is in its whole length of about even thickness, is also closely related to the old *Camacolaimus tardus* DE MAN, from which it seems to differ only by the shape of the tail.

Cuticle finely annulated. Buccal cavity typical, the dorsal wall of which being as usually thickened. Tail short, not as in *C. tardus* exactly conical, but instead in the greatest part cylindrical, and in the posteriormost part, measuring a length of $13,6 \mu$, uniformly more strongly thinned, with an elongated, slender, conical endtip.

When the animal was to be prepared on the mount, it was unfortunately cut off just in the region of the vulva, the position of which therefore was not to be determined nearer.

Female organs paired, probably with dorsally reflexed ovaries.

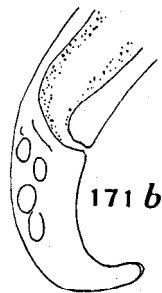


Fig. 171. *Camacolaimus paratardus* n. sp. a. Anterior end, b. Tail, $\times 600$
