

*Choniolaimus papillatus* Ditlevsen, 1918  
(Fig. 134)

*Description.* Body length 2.5–2.8 mm:  $a = 29$ –57. Four longer  $10\text{ }\mu\text{m}$  and six shorter papilliform cephalic setae. Amphids variously described as having 2.5–5.25 turns, 0.4–0.5 c.d. Tail 1.7–2.4 a.b.d., differently shaped from *C. panicus* (p. 292) with anterior half conical and posterior half cylindrical.

Spicules  $76\text{ }\mu\text{m}$ , similar to *C. panicus*. 11–13 cup-shaped precloacal supplements.

*Distribution.* Whitstable, South East England (harbour mud).

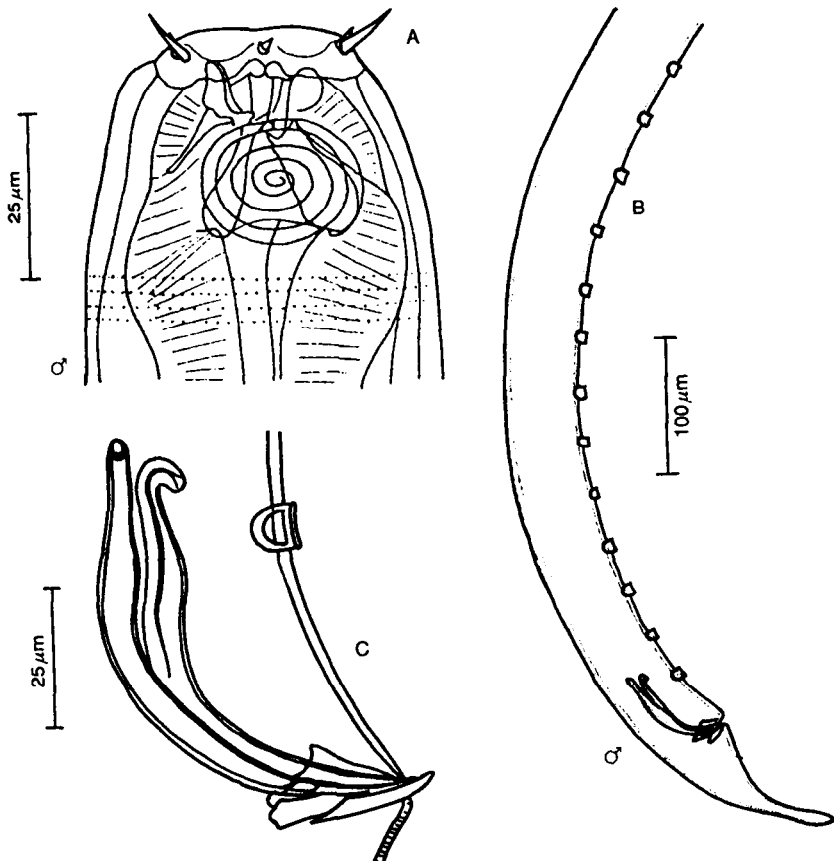


Fig. 134. *Choniolaimus papillatus*. A, Male head. From Gerlach (1964). B, Male tail; C, Cloacal region. From Ditlevsen (1918).
