


Fig. 134. Choniolaimus papillatus. A, Male head. From Gerlach (1964). B, Male tail; C, Cloacal region. From Ditlevsen (1918).

## Choniolaimus papillatus Ditlevsen, 1918 (Fig. 134)

Description. Body length 2.5–2.8 mm: a=29-57. Four longer  $10~\mu m$  and six shorter papilliform cephalic setae. Amphids variously described as having 2.5–5.25 turns, 0.4–0.5 c.d. Tail 1.7–2.4 a.b.d., differently shaped from C. panicus (p. 292) with anterior half conical and posterior half cylindrical. Spicules  $76~\mu m$ , similar to C. panicus. 11-13 cup-shaped precloacal supplements.

Distribution. Whitstable, South East England (harbour mud).
