


Fig. 61. Graphonema scampae. A, Head (deep focus showing buccal armature); B, Spicules and gubernaculum; C, Lateral cuticle just posterior to oesophagus. From Coles (1965a).

## Graphonema scampae (Coles, 1965) (Fig. 61)

Description. Body length 1.3–2.1 mm. Maximum diameter  $38-72 \mu m$  (a = 28–39). Cuticle punctations on head oval, only a little smaller than the rows of hexagonal blocks commencing just posterior to buccal cavity. Lateral cuticle in middle of body with elongated punctations; lateral plates weakly developed. Longer cephalic setae  $8 \mu m$ . Dorsal tooth small, solid but deeply set into the buccal cavity wall thus giving the appearance of a hollow tooth. Two simple tooth-like projections ventrally.

Spicules 50–62  $\mu$ m, slightly S-shaped, alate. Telamons 27–36  $\mu$ m, simple L-shaped without teeth or projections.

Distribution. Coast of north and south Devon; Isles of Scilly; Isle of Man (intertidal seaweeds).
