

*Microlaimus zosterae* Allgén, 1930  
(Fig. 187)

*Description.* Body length 0.7–0.8 mm. Maximum diameter 21–24  $\mu\text{m}$  ( $a = 28$ –39). Body characteristically reddish. Six cephalic setae difficult to distinguish; four short 1.5–2  $\mu\text{m}$  (0.25 h.d.) cephalic setae. Somatic setae absent. Amphids 5–6  $\mu\text{m}$  (0.5 c.d.) wide, 1.5–1.6 h.d. posterior. Buccal cavity lightly cuticularised, teeth only slight projections. Tail 2.8–4.6 a.b.d.

Spicules 22–23  $\mu\text{m}$  (1.1–1.2 a.b.d.), arcuate. Gubernaculum 12–14  $\mu\text{m}$ , curved proximally and free from spicules. Supplements absent.

Vulva at 53% of body length.

*Distribution.* Strangford Lough, North East Ireland (intertidal sand).




Fig. 187. *Microlaimus zosterae*. A, Male head; B, Male tail; C, Spicules and gubernaculum. Original.
