
Sabatieria tubilaima n. sp.

Locality and material. — Falkland Islands, St. 49: 12

Dimensions: L = 2,117 mm., $\alpha = 34,15$, $\beta = 8,40$, $\gamma = 34,15$, V = 60, 23 % A dubious *Comesomid* of the genus *Sabatieria*, characterized by its short, cylindrical buccal cavity. Cuticle finely annulated, structured by transverse rows of smallest, evenly large granules. Head rounded. Cephalic bristles were not found. Buccal cavity short, cylindrical. Lateral organs situated at the base of the buccal cavity, large, spiral-shaped. Tail short, clumsy, in the posterior part curved dorsally, and uniformly more strongly thinned. In front of the vulva a single shell-egg with the dimensions: $141 \times 54 \mu$.

St. 49. Falkland Islands. Berkeley Sound. 51° 35′ S. — 57° 56′ W. Shells and stones. 25—30 m. 10. 8. 1902. Number of species found: 27; Number of specimens found: 58.






Fig. 149. Sabatieria tubilaima n. sp. a. Anterior end, b. Tail, × 450
