Hesse's generic name was not etymologically correct - he should have inserted the to.

Body oval. large; cephalothorax twice the length of the 3 following seg'ts., which form together a circle. Anterior margin of head with membranous margin like Caligus and Pandarus. Genital seg't. spindle-shaped. Abdomen cylindrical, basal joint the shortest. Anal laminae short, cylindrical, with stiff bristles. 2nd antennae 3-jointed, uncinate; 4th. legs biramose, rami 3-jointed; 5th. legs uniramose, 1-jointed. 2nd. antennae short, uncinate; maxillary hooks present.
