Differs from Calanus by its large body; by the mouth parts being transformed into rigid spines; by the strong developement of the swimming legs - whose exopod is very large, with its terminal joint armed with 3 stout spines in the three anterior pairs - 5^o legs of the male only slightly transformed, and distinguished from those of the female only by the lack of swimming setae on the exopods.
