

*Euchromadora gaulica* Inglis, 1962  
(Fig. 59B)




Fig. 59. *Euchromadora striata*. A, Spicules and gubernaculum. *Euchromadora gaulica*. B, Spicules and gubernaculum. From Coles (1965a).

*Description.* Body length 1.2–1.8 mm. Maximum diameter 38–85  $\mu\text{m}$  ( $a = 20$ –31). Longer cephalic setae 10–12  $\mu\text{m}$ . Head and oesophagus very similar to preceding two species but smaller. Spicules 44–54  $\mu\text{m}$ , slender, equal in length with a distinctive elbow-like curve towards the proximal end which is more pronounced in some specimens than others. Telamons 24–34  $\mu\text{m}$ , bent at much less than a right angle with the distal arm relatively short and without obvious teeth or projections (Fig. 59B).

*Distribution.* Several localities on the north and south coasts of Devon; Brighton, Sussex, South East England; Littlehampton, Sussex, South East England (intertidal seaweeds).
