Sacculus, a sack and ὄψις, likeness.

Body saccate or conical, not jointed, without any rudiments of appendages, anteriorly fastened by a petiolate bulla with reflexed margin, posteriorly increasing in width and furnished with 2 minute tubercles carrying the egg sacks, between which is a round aperture (vulva?). Egg sacks cylindrical, longer than the body and half as wide.
