


Fig. 220. Dasynemoides albaensis. A, Male head; B, Female head; C, Female tail; D, Spicules and gubernaculum. Original.

## Dasynemoides albaensis (Warwick and Platt, 1973) (Fig. 220)

Description. Body length 1.4–1.6 mm. Maximum diameter  $22-29 \,\mu$ m (a = 52–73). Cuticle with eight longitudinal ridges in the anterior and posterior regions, ten in the middle region and six near the tail tip. Cephalic capsule  $27-33 \,\mu$ m long,  $17-18 \,\mu$ m wide, with eight cuticular ribs extending forwards from its base. Six 7–10  $\mu$ m and four 10–15  $\mu$ m cephalic setae. Somatic setae absent. Amphids a closed loop,  $5 \,\mu$ m wide and oval in outline in male, 6–7  $\mu$ m wide and circular in female. Buccal cavity absent. Tail 6–7 a.b.d., with 23–31  $\mu$ m end cone.

Spicules 24  $\mu$ m (1.2 a.b.d.), arcuate with a weakly cuticularised proximal end. Gubernaculum 15  $\mu$ m

Vulva at 52-54% of body length.

Distribution. Loch Ewe, West Scotland (intertidal sand).
