Halicylindrolaimus conicaudatus n. sp.


Localities and material. — Falkland Islands, St. 49: 12; South Georgia, St. 23b: 333, 2 juv.

Dimensions: $\delta L = 3{,}317 \text{ mm.}, \quad \alpha = 26{,}85, \quad \beta = 7{,}06, \quad \gamma = 19{,}30$

Body moderately slender. Cuticle thin and smooth. Head truncate to rounded. Cephalic bristles not observed. Buccal cavity bordered by thin walls, broad, cylindrical. Lateral organs situated about 10 μ behind the front end, rounded, large, measuring in section 6 μ , i. e. 2/5 of the corresponding head diameter. Oesophagus short, probably bulb-like swollen posteriorly. Tail short, conical, posteriorly rounded, measuring 1,6 \times the anal body diameter. Spicules short, strongly curved, thickest in their proximal part, posteriorly pointed. Accessory piece slender, its apophysis directed dorsally and posteriorly.




Fig. 240. Halicylindrolaimus phusicaudatus n. sp. a. Anterior end, × 450, b. Tail and spicules, × 350
