

**Paracanthonchus falklandiae** n. sp.

Locality and material. — Falkland Islands, St. 40: 1♀

Dimensions: L = 1,394 mm.,  $\alpha = ?$ ,  $\beta = 6,34$ ,  $\gamma = 12,11$ .

Body of this species, similar to that of *P. conicaudatus*, described by the present author (1928) from the Campbell Island, is in its whole length about evenly thick. Cuticle annulated and structured in usual manner by evenly large, minute granules. Foremost part of the head demarcated from the body by a constriction. Buccal cavity large, armed with a small dorsal tooth. Oesophagus increasing gradually posteriorly, and the muscles interrupted in its posterior part.

Tail *straight, short, conical*, with conical end tip; its length  $3,29 \times$  the anal body diameter.

The vulva was not to be stated. Female organs short, not reflexed. In the anterior branch there was near the vulva a single small granulated egg.

St. 40. Falkland Islands. Berkeley Sound.  $51^{\circ} 33' S.$  —  $58^{\circ} 0' W.$  Gravel and shells with algae. 16 m. Bottom temp. —  $2,75 C.$  19. 7. 1902.

Number of species found: 54; Number of specimens found: 291.




Fig. 98. *Paracanthonchus falklandiae* n. sp. a. Anterior end, b. Tail,  $\times 600$
