


Fig. 119. Paracanthonchus macrodon. A, Male head; B, Male tail; C, Spicules and gubernaculum. Original.

## Paracanthonchus macrodon (Ditlevsen, 1919) (Fig. 119)

Description. Body length 2.8 mm: a = 29-35. Cuticle with transverse rows of dots slightly larger in the lateral fields. Four shorter  $8 \mu m$  and six longer  $10.5 \mu m$  (0.4 h.d.) cephalic setae. Amphids of 4 turns,  $13 \mu m$  (0.3 c.d.) wide. Buccal cavity with a large solid pointed dorsal tooth and two pairs of small subventral teeth. Tail 3.8 a.b.d.

Spicules 55  $\mu$ m (0.8 a.b.d.). Gubernaculum 56  $\mu$ m, massively enlarged distally with numerous terminal denticles and a row of small lateral denticles (Fig. 119C). Ventral precloacal pair of cuticular flaps. Four curved tubular preclaocal supplements and subventral rows of short flaccid setae.

Distribution. Isle of Cumbrae, West Scotland (kelp bed).
