

Paralinhomoeus tenuicaudatus BÜTSCHLI

BÜTSCHLI 1874, p. 268, pl. III, fig. 16 a—d

Locality and material. — Falkland Islands, St. 42a: 1♀

Dimensions: $L = 2,830$ mm., $\alpha = 56,6$, $\beta = 14,4$, $\gamma = 12,30$

Although the prepared animal had the foremost part of its body totally covered with minute stone-particles and therefore was rather unsuitable for close study and examination, I regard the single female from Greenpatch, Falklands, as synonymous with *Linhomoeus tenuicaudatus*, described already by BÜTSCHLI in 1874 from the Bay of Kiel.

St. 42a. Falkland Islands. Port Louis: Greenpatch. Material shaken up from algae and kelp-rhizoids, cast up on shore by storm. 30. 7. 1902.
